He could spend hours watching cartoons and shows, looking through YouTube videos, and playing video games, while cuddling close to those he loved so much. He loved many cartoons and all superheroes, just as any young boy would. The characters inspired him so deeply that he would often change his persona; one day he would be Sonic the Hedgehog and the next Spiderman. He was a chameleon in his own way as he was forever changing his identity, for he understood life is too short to be only one character on this stage called life. He enjoyed spending time playing and learning at the library, getting snow cones on warm summer days, and Chinese lunch dates with his Mother. Even with the ability

to eat any kind and as much Chinese food as wanted, there was always room for pizza, mac and cheese, and sweat tea.

With Jaxon's passing we remind others that his life is one to be celebrated, although we will miss him everyday, especially his winning smile, he will always remain forever in our hearts. Through his teachings about life, we were able to create wonderful memories and it has been a privilege to be a part of his life. We are so thankful to all those family and friends who were able to spend time and make memories with him. Thousands of people have followed his story since he was born and he touched so many lives in so many different ways.
