Gail was a member of the Class of 1970 at Worth County High School where she was a standout basketball player. She graduated from the University of Georgia in 1973, teaching briefly at Worth Academy before joining the faculty of Worth County High School as a Business Education Teacher. Gail received her Master's degree from Georgia Southwestern University in 1976 and continued to teach at Worth County High School for over forty-two years. She was a dedicated educator who rarely missed a day of school. Through the years, Gail was both a sponsor of the Future Business Leaders of America and an avid supporter of the Worth County Rams football team. She worked diligently to teach life lessons to her students and to prepare them for future employment. Gail loved the University of Georgia Bulldogs and adored her grandchildren beyond measure. She was most proud of her daughters, Laura and Haley, and greatly enjoyed the times that she and her husband William spent with their families. Gail had many life-time friends who will greatly miss her sense of humor, her forthright manner, and her acts of kindness. She was

valued by her fellow educators as a strong teacher who instilled self-discipline and a sense of responsibility in her students. Mrs. Sams was a faithful member of First Baptist Church of Sylvester where she attended Sunday School and was a ringer in the hand bell choir for many years. For the last several years she greatly enjoyed her work as a volunteer with the Alpha Pregnancy Center in Albany, Georgia.
