



## MGySgt George E. Phillips

February 11, 1937 - January 8, 2022

MGySgt George E. Phillips (ret.), 84, of Worth County, died Saturday January 8, 2022 at his residence.

The remains were cremated and a memorial service will be held at 11:00 AM on Thursday January 13, 2022 at the Banks Funeral Home Chapel with full military honors. The Rev. Bobby Joe Brown will officiate.

Mr. Phillips was born in Webster County, West Virginia on February 11, 1937 to the late Fenton and Tessie Faulkner Phillips. 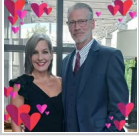
