Mrs. Joyce Carter Smith, 82, of Tifton, died on Monday, January 6, 2025, at her residence.

Joyce had a long and rewarding career as a cake decorator. She began her career at the Well known Milady Bakery in Tifton, where she learned cake decorating under the supervision of co-owner Mable Rhodes. After 13 years at Milady Bakery, she decided to buy a florist and she used her artistic abilities to create beautiful floral arrangements. Her next career move was to Food Max as a cake decorator and then deli-bakery manager. After 8 years at Food Max, Joyce was recruited by the J. H. Harvey Company to use her decorating expertise to train new employees in the deli-bakery departments in the new Harvey grocery stores throughout South Georgia. The exemplary work Joyce exhibited at Harvey's led to her recruited by the H.C. Brill Company of Tucker, Georgia, as their service technician for their Harvey's Account. Brill provided many of the bakery products. She retired after 10 years at Brill, and spent her retirement years being nana for her 3 grandchildren whom she adored. Her granddaughters always loved calling their "nana" and hearing her answer the phone, "Hey Darling". Her grandsons loved planting flowers with her. Joyce was a member of Pine Hill Baptist Church in Sumner.

Survivors include her son, Monty Smith (Lane) of Poulan; grandchildren, Keaton Smith, Makalah Smith, Jack Smith and Katie Spears; siblings, Pat
