Garland Whiddon Rowland of Sylvester, Ga, died on December 26, 2011 at her residence. A Celebration of Life Services will be Wednesday December 28, 2011 at 11:00 AM held in the First Baptist Church, Sylvester, Ga. with Dr. Ben Bush, Dr. Tom Jacobs and Rev. Charles E. Brown, Jr. officiating.

Visitation will be at Banks Funeral Home, Sylvester, Ga. on Tuesday from 6:00-8:00 PM. .Interment will follow at the Hillcrest Cemetery, Sylvester, Ga.

Active pallbearers will be Ashley Grady Whiddon, Hunter Whiddon, Eric Foster-Whiddon, Craig Goodroe, Luke Goodroe and Wade Ethridge. Honorary Pall bears will be classmates of Garland's 1962 Doerun High School Graduating class.

Garland was born on April 11, 1944 In Worth County, Ga. near Doerun on the Grady Whiddon Home Place, She was the daughter of the late Alvin Grady and Zora Lee Medders Whiddon. She was preceded in death by her Husband, William Donald "Don"

Rowland in December 1995. She is survived by her son David Gary Rowland (Monica), her special grandson, Cameron David Rowland, a sister Dorothy Whiddon Ethridge (Tommy); a brother David Lee Whiddon (Susan); a look-alike niece Melissa Ethridge Goodroe (Craig); four nephews – Wade Ethridge, Ashley Grady Whiddon; Hunter Whiddon; and Eric Foster-Whiddon and 3 great nephews – Luke Goodroe, Lane Goodroe, Holton Foster-Whiddon, and 3 great nieces –Alexis Foster-Whiddon, Zoe Foster-Whiddon and Karis Foster-Whiddon .

Garland loved the Lord and was an active member of the First Baptist Church, Sylvester, Ga where she was a member of the Fidelis Sunday School Class, The Adult Choir, and the Brandon Circle. Garland loved singing in the choir and very much missed doing that during her illness. Garland was devoted to her family.

Garland retired from the Marine Corps Logistics Base, Albany, Ga in January 2001 after 36 years of service as a Supervisory Logistics Management Specialist.. At that time of her retirement, she began helping her son with his motor sports business (racing go-karts), Performance Engine & Chassis, Inc. She served as his business manager and consultant while they traveled throughout the Southeastern USA promoting karting and selling parts and accessories for karting . Garland was affectionately known and loved by many of the racing family and others as "Mama G".

In 2005, Garland was inducted into the Colquitt County Sports Hall of Fame. This significant honor was based upon Garland's accomplishments in basketball while attending Doerun High School during the late 50's and early 1960's. Her scoring exploits are still remembered by many in Doerun and Sylvester who packed the basketball gyms One of her most memorable accomplishments came in the 1961 Invitational Tournament in Sylvester in which she scored 114 points in 3 games including 43 points in the championship game. She was recruited by the All American Red Heads professional basketball team.

In 2009, Garland was diagnosed with Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS). Just like many others who die as a result of this disease, she never gave up. She fought the dreadful disease with courage and dignity and lived by the words of Paul, I fought a good fight, I have finished the race and kept the faith. One of her prayers was: God help me to accept the things I cannot change, the courage to change the things I can and the wisdom to know the difference. The family would like to say a special thanks to her caregiver, Inday Rayl and to her sister, Dotty for caring for her when Inday was off.
