He attended the FBI Nat'l Academy in 1976, 106th Session. He was promoted to Chief of communications for Fulton County in 1984 where he planned, designed and implemented Fulton County E-911 system. He retired in 1991 and later was hired to put in the E-911 system for Worth and Tift counties. He was a life member of the National Emergency Numbering Association. He was a life-long member of First Baptist Church, Sylvester, GA, and a member of the Upper Room Sunday School class.

Funeral services will be held at 3 p.m. on Friday March 4, 2011 at the First Baptist Church in Sylvester, GA. with interment to follow in the Hillcrest
