“ As far back as my memory takes me, the Walls family were friends, relatives and neighbors. Although I had known Virgle since I was a preschooler, it was actually around age 12 that I really felt like I had a measure of the man. It was then that several youngsters from the neighborhood helped the Walls Farm in gathering tobacco once a week. It was immediately apparent that Virgle Walls was not a farmer that rode around in a pickup and supervised the activity. He was in his overalls first thing every morning and was in the field "cropping" tobacco with the rest of us. It was also memorable that we finished around noon each day and it was then that Virgle's wife Agnes and Mother, Mrs. Laura Walls put on a spread that was indeed something that has stuck in my memory. Virgle is the only man I have known that was born in a house and lived for 97 years in that same home. We were not close relatives; however, Virgle's Mother and my Father were first cousins. I will always feel like I was privileged to have known Virgle and his family. As a farmer he was a noble professional and I know his family will always remember him with great pride.
